The Southern Baptist Convention has been making the news lately and what has been revealed is not good. At the S.B.C. in Nashville, TN, in 2021, a motion was passed to have an independent investigation of possible cover-up of sex abuse cases. At the 2022 convention in California, recommendations have been made to follow up on the findings. All of this situation is tragic, especially for the victims.

The S.B.C. executive committee spent \$5 million on the investigations. The executive committee is proposing we spend another \$9 million on this case as lawsuits are pending. They are talking about using Co-Operative Program dollars for this case which should be the individual churches with infractions. I will be sharing with you soon about how to direct our C.P. funds so they by-pass our headquarters in Nashville and go straight to missions.
