You have been blessed to serve as Senior Pastor of Pleasant Valley South Baptist Church since 1997, but I believe they have been more blessed over these twenty-seven years. You have done an incredible job leading this wonderful congregation and God's Kingdom is better because of you.

1997 seems like a lifetime ago. Just think how much the world has changed in the past twenty-seven years since you came to PVSBC...

- Titanic was the number one movie at the box office and the first Harry Potter book came out.
- Netflix was started, the first Wi-Fi was invented, and Google.com was registered as a domain name.
- It's also the year Princess Diana died and the comet Hale-Bopp passed by Earth.
- Tiger Woods became the youngest golfer to ever win the Masters.
- The price of a new home was \$176,000, the median household income was \$37,000, the price for a gallon of gas was \$1.22, a gallon of milk was \$2.50, a dozen eggs cost 92¢, and a loaf of bread was 89¢.

It is a much different world today and you have led Pleasant Valley South well during so many changes and challenges.

There are so many individuals who could speak about your investment in their lives. How you visited them, cared for them, taught them God's Word, and how you have led them. Here is a little of what I discovered when I looked at the past twenty-seven years at PVSBC

- Church membership has increased from 1,028 to 2,263. That is an increase of 1,235 or growth of 120%.
- In twenty-seven years there have been 760 new believers in Jesus baptized at PVSBC!
- There have been another 1,440 new members added.
- Since 1997, PVSBC has given \$3,988,660 to missions! This includes the Cooperative Program, Lottie Moon, Annie Armstrong, and the Floyd County Baptist Association.

Your leadership has made a difference, and it will continue to make a difference for years to come.

I am grateful for your leadership at PVSBC; as well as the FCBA, the Georgia Baptist Convention, and the Southern Baptist Convention. But most of all I am thankful for your friendship and encouragement. In my three years at the FCBA you've made time for me, you've helped me and you've encouraged me. Thank you for all you have done for me in these past few years.

You will be missed but I know that God is not through with you, and I look forward to seeing what He has planned for you. I do encourage you to take some time off and enjoy this new season of life.


